Digital Skills Training

Graphic Design: Learning to Visualize with Free Tools

Prerequisites:

1. A basic knowledge of graphic design.
2. A love for design.
3. Good communication skills.
4. The willingness to take on a new challenge
5. The ability to work with a team.

Description:



This 12-hour workshop aims to introduce young persons to the basics of graphic design. Using open-source and free web tools, students will explore the elements and principles of design, color theory, typography, and digital illustration. Students will also learn about time management and mindfulness practices. The workshop will culminate with a project that will allow them to apply their newfound skills and knowledge in a practical setting.

Learning Outcomes:


In this workshop participants will:

1. Understand the basic principles and elements of graphic design.
2. Apply color theory and typography in designing visual materials.
3. Utilize open-source and free web tools for graphic design.
4. Develop a basic digital illustration using the learned tools.
5. Develop an awareness of the interrelatedness of graphic design and photography.
6. Employ effective time management skills in completing projects.
7. Appreciate the importance of mindfulness and stress management in the creative process.
8. Create a simple graphic design project showcasing their learned skills.

Share examples of well- and poorly-designed websites with emphasis on color schemes[5]. b. Interactive Activity: Utilize free online tools to create simple web layouts with proper color coordination. 2. Project-Based Learning: Logo & Poster Design (45 minutes) <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Logo Design: Brief introduction to logo creation and brand guidelines[1]. Encourage participants to create logos using free graphic design tools, considering color and typography.

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		<p>b. Poster Design: Utilize open-source design software to create posters, flyers, or brochures. Highlight the application of color theory and typography. Allow participants to work on a music album art or movie film poster as mentioned in the resources[3].</p> <p>Review & Evaluation (30 minutes)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Peer Review & Critique (15 minutes) <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Group Sharing: Allow participants to present their designs to the class. Peer Evaluation: Encourage constructive feedback focusing on the application of color theory, typography, composition, and balance. Reflection & Wrap-up (15 minutes) <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Reflection: Encourage participants to reflect on what they learned and how they can apply it in future projects.
